- They are native to Australia and New Guinea.
- They are nocturnal or most active at night.

- Sometimes they are green and sometimes they are brown.
 They camouflage themselves very well.
- They are not great swimmers but enjoy soaking in water.
- They shed their skin.
- Dumpy Tree Frogs have sticky pads, like suction cups, on their toes that help them climb.

Carnivore, Omnivore, Herbivore Sort:


- Print the attached pages and cut out sorting pieces.
